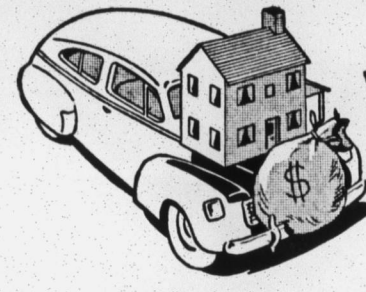
How It's Accomplished
