

## Favorable Weather Spurs Harvesting Of Peanuts In Section

### Damage Due to Late Harvesting Varies Considerably

Favorable weather during the past week in the Virginia-Carolina area resulted in resumption of harvesting of peanuts still in the field and some increase in the movement of farmers' stock. This movement, however, still continues light. Damage in this late harvested stock varies considerably. Some lots do not show excessively heavy damage considering the late date for harvesting, while other lots show a very high percentage of damage. In the Southeast movement of farmers' stock peanuts to mills has been extremely light. Most of the remaining farmers' stock are being held for seed. In the Southeast some mills have ample seed supplies, while others appear to be a little short. Planting continues in a limited way in south Texas. In the Southeast planting is still several weeks away unless an unusually early period of warm, dry weather prevails. Some mills in both the Southeast and Southwest are now using a fairly large proportion of their available labor for mixing fertilizer and to a limited extent to the preparation of seed.

Demand for cleaned and shelled goods in all sections continues far in excess of the available supply, with the exception of cleaned fancy in the Virginia-Carolina area. There seems to be some accumulation of fancy in the hands of some millers. For other grades in all sections practically the entire movement is under previous commitments. Sales f. o. b. shipping point, per lb. Virginia-Carolina, Virginias shelled extra large and mediums 16 1/4c; No. 1, 14 5/8c; cleaned, jumbos 15 1/4c, fancy mostly 15 1/4c, with some at 15-15 1/8c. Southeastern, shelled Spanish No. 1, 14 1/4c; Runners No. 1, 14c. Southwestern, shelled Spanish No. 1, 14 1/2c.

## WELFARE REPORT

According to the monthly report of Mrs. J. H. McMullan, superintendent of public welfare, 97 persons in Chowan County received old age assistance during the month of February. There were 16 aid to dependent children cases, who received \$486 and six aid to blind cases who received \$129.

During the month \$62.58 was spent for general relief and \$125.30 for other financial assistance.

Mrs. McMullan reported four adult prison parolees under supervision, nine adult mental cases under supervision, 11 cases screened for the Selective Service Board and two child labor certificates issued.

## Prices For Cotton Reach New High

### Ten Spot Markets Report Average of 26.56 Cents Per Pound

Cotton prices advanced into new high ground late last week following declines on Monday and Tuesday. Ceiling prices on cotton yarns have recently been increased and increases for cotton fabrics are under consideration. A mid-February parity 12 points higher than a month earlier was announced after the close of the market on Thursday. This was in line with trade expectations. It was also announced late Thursday that after March 15 sales of commodity credit corporation stocks of owned and pooled cotton will be on a bid basis. The cotton will be sold to the highest bidder, but bids will not be accepted below parity. Reported spot sales continued seasonally high but were smaller in volume than a week earlier.

Prices for middling 15/16 inch in the ten spot markets averaged 26.56 cents per pound on Thursday, February 28, against 26.30 cents a week earlier and 21.80 a year ago. The parity prices as of mid-February was 22.07 cents against 21.95 for January and 21.33 in February 1945. Prices received by producers as of mid-February averaged 23.01 cents against 22.36 for January and 19.99 cents for February, 1945. Mid-February farm prices were 104 percent of parity against 94 percent a year earlier.
