Edenton Couple Married In Raleigh Wednesday of Last Week

Two Edenton people figured in a wedding solemnized in Raleigh last week, when on Wednesday afternoon Miss Sara Frances Hurdle, daughter of Mrs. R. W. Hurdle and the late Mr. Hurdle became the bride of Raymond Lee Everett, son of George Everett and the late Mrs. Everett. The ceremony took place in the Poindexter Memorial Chapel of the Edenton Street Methodist Church, the pastor, the Rev. A. J. Hobbs, officiating.

Nuptial music was provided by Mrs. Esther P. Marshburn as soloist and Mrs. J. Fielding Reed, pianist.

The bridal couple entered the church together. Vet Question Box

Q. Will Veterans Administration guarantee a GI loan for a loan that I can use during my vacation and for taking occasional fishing trips?

A. No. Loans for pleasure purposes cannot be guaranteed or insured by Veterans Administration.

Q. For what term of years can a guaranteed loan be made?

A. Payments must be such that the veteran will repay his home or business real estate loan within 25 years, a farm loan within 40 years, and a non-real estate loan within 10 years.

Q. Is there any way that I can get Veterans Administration to deduct my National Service Life Insurance premiums from the monthly disability compensation check mailed to me each month?

A. Yes. You may go to any VA regional office or to a contact office and fill out a form which will authorize Veterans Administration to make the deduction from your compensation check.

Q. I want to change the beneficiary on my National Service Life Insurance, but I don't want the old beneficiary to know about it. Am I permitted to do this?

A. Yes. A veteran may change the beneficiary or beneficiaries of his NSLI at any time without their knowledge or consent.

Q. I recently lost my job and can't meet the payments on my GI guaranteed home loan. Am I entitled to get the readjustment compensation provided by the GI Bill?

A. Yes, you are entitled to readjustment allowance. Your home loan has no bearing on your right to unemployment compensation. You should apply to your state unemployment service to receive readjustment allowance.
