Progress Noted In Plan To Inaugurate Community Chest

Lions Name Committee To Work With Rotary Club

Dr. George Crawford reports some progress in the inauguration of a community chest in Edenton by which so many various drives would be eliminated and instead one major drive staged each year, with all of the various agencies receiving a proportionate share of the contributions. The idea was instigated by the Rotary Club with Dr. Crawford and Meredith Jones appointed to work out details.

They contacted the Lions Club, and T. C. Byrum, C E Byrum R. C. Holland and Mayor Leroy Haskett were appointed to cooperate in the movement.

The board of directors of the Chamher of Commerce last week also voted to unite in the effort to inaugurate a community chest. Secretary Peter Carlton was instructed to arrange a meeting of representative groups in the county within a few days to take more concrete steps in putting the plan in operation.

It is contended that one major drive would eliminate much duplication of work and an imposition on some people who are called upon to solicit contributions in more than one drive. Then, too, it is pointed out that the idea would be welcomed by merchants and individuals alike in that they would ne solicited only once a year instead of being bothered several times a year for a contribution for this or that purpose.



NORTH KNOWING Q. How fast do rats reproduce?

A. Rats begin to breed at two to three months of age, and the period of gestation is about 21 days. The average litter is probably ten, and one female may have from three to four litters a year. Grower Determines Future Of Cotton ed when the fertilizer is placed in

Efficient production is the answer to the fears being expressed for the future of cotton.

Dr. W. L. Nelson, agronomist with the N. C. Agricultural Experiment Station, in making this statement, points out that years of research with cotton have proved the value of certain fundamental practices for its production and if the grower is to keep the crop on a paying basis he will have to adopt these practices.

First among the important practices to be listed among these fundamentals would be soil testing, and liming with dolomitic limestone in accordance with the findings of the soil tests.

For the Coastal Plain area, he recommends the use of 600 pounds per acre of 3-9-9 or 3-9-12 fertilizer, depending upon the rotation used. This
