Demonstration Club
Week In ProgressPurpose to Inform More
People About Type
Of Work Done

Sunday marked the opening of National Home Demonstration Week, the theme of which is "Today's Home Builds Tomorrow's World."

"Possibly there are folks who wonder why we have a Home Demonstration Week at all," says Miss Rebecca Colwell, Chowan County Home Agent. "If that's as far as we go, then it's high time we had more Home Demonstration Weeks, because the home in home demonstration week belongs to you."

"In other words, the whole purpose of setting aside a definite week, May 4 to 11, is to tell more people about home demonstration work. The best way to do that is to describe what homemakers are doing right here in this county. And there are 3,000 other counties in the United States that have the same idea. At the same time, it applies whether you live in town or on the farm."

"And don't let anybody tell you it doesn't concern the men, for it does. Good homes are for everybody who lives in them, not just good food on the table, but safety, health, convenience and pleasant recreation."

"It's all in the home demonstration picture. One way of starting is with a home demonstration club. Clubs are organized in a community with the aid of the county home demonstration agent. It's her job to help the club members learn new things that will make home and family life more enjoyable."

Every woman is urged to join the club in her community, and women in unorganized communities should see the home agent about organizing a club.
