Miles Shirley Burke, ex-Steward's mate first class, USNR, has received the Navy and Marine Corps Medal for heroic conduct from Rear Admiral E. P. Forrestal, USN, Commander of the Naval Base and Norfolk Naval Station.

The citation, signed by James Forrestal, Secretary of the Navy, for the President of the United States,

"For heroic conduct while attached to the USS Bush following the sinking of that vessel in the vicinity of Okinawa, April 6, 1945. In the water and on a raft for five hours, Burke supported two exhausted men who were unable to swim and one of whom was without a life jacket. Burke, who had two years in the Navy during the war, lives with his wife and their six children in Chowan County, Route 1, Edenton, where he is employed in a lumber mill.


