

Agriculture Board Planning Five-Year Program in County

Special Emphasis Being Placed on 4-H Club Work

Chowan County Board of Agriculture has met the last two Friday nights for the purpose of cooperating with the county and assistant agents in program planning. It was determined to establish plans on the basis of a 5-year program. Under Engineering, drainage was selected as the most serious problem and sufficient shelter room for housing farm machinery placed second.

Field Crops—Average corn yield of 40 bushels per acre; Peanuts—Improvement of our Jumbo type variety, at least a 3 year rotation for peanuts, and work for a N. C. Experiment Station. Cotton—one variety, system for better seed use, and at least 50% of growers picking cotton on sheets rather than packing it in bags. Increase in the production of small grain. At least one good acre of permanent pasture on every farm.

Under Animal Husbandry—Beef cattle need to be improved by herd testing and using better bulls. Hogs should be increased 25% with improvement in breeding stock. At least 600 family cows placed on the farms in Chowan County and the establishment of one Grade A Dairy.

Forestry—Reforestation of 1,000 acres of cut-over bushy land. Systematic thinning of at least 500 acres of timber. Proper fire protection measures provided on at least 5,000 acres of timber land. Selective practices on at least 1,000 acres.

4-H Club work was thought to be the most important phase of the farm program. Several of the Board members stated that the boys and girls are flexible in their thinking and lend themselves more readily to practicing better farm and home methods than older people. In training the younger people, farmers and farm women of tomorrow are being trained.

It was felt that the 4-H program in the County needs to be revised to the extent that it will hold the interest of club members as they grow older, that the program should be so arranged that it will interest more boys and girls, that a definite project working agreement should exist between the member and his parents so that the club member in every case realizes the profits or a definite portion of the profits from his or her project. It is hoped to revise the 5-year program of work and put it into a usable form during the next two or three meetings.

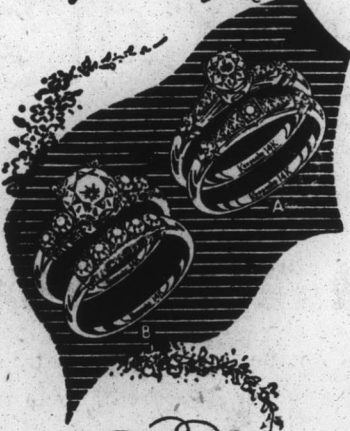
