

COUNTY OF CHOWAN, NORTH CAROLINA.
NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election will be held in the County of Chowan, North Carolina, on January 20th, 1948, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said County, for their approval or disapproval, the bond order adopted by the Board of Commissioners of said County on November 3, 1947, and also the indebtedness proposed to be incurred by the issuance of the bonds authorized by such bond order.

The bond order is entitled "Bond Order authorizing the issuance of \$400,000 School Bonds of the County of Chowan" and authorizes bonds of the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$400,000 to finance the cost of providing the additional school facilities hereinafter described and determines that such school facilities are necessary in order that the County of Chowan, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, may maintain public schools in said County for the six months term required by the Constitution of North Carolina. The additional school facilities consist of (1) erecting, equipping and furnishing a new building to be used as a physical education building and a new building to be used as a school garage building at the Chowan County High School in the Chowan County Administrative Unit, and (2) erecting, equipping and furnishing new buildings containing additional class rooms required for the Edenton White Schools and the Edenton Colored Schools, in the Edenton School Administrative Unit.

The bond order also authorizes the levy of an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds authorized thereby.

The polls for the election will open at the hour of 6:30 A. M., and will close at the hour of 6:30 P. M., Eastern Standard Time. The election will be held at the same polling places at which the last election was held in Chowan County for the election of

members of the General Assembly. The registration books shall be opened for the registration of voters at 9:00 o'clock A. M., on December 27, 1947, and shall be closed at sunset on January 10, 1948. On each day (Sundays excepted) during such period, the Registrar for each election precinct in the County will keep the books open between the hours of 9:00 o'clock A. M., and sunset for the registration of voters in such election precinct. On each Saturday during such period each Registrar will attend at the polling place in his election precinct between the hours of 9:00 o'clock A. M. and sunset for the registration of voters.
