

4-H Club Members Consider Poultry Project For 1948

Club Meetings Postponed Due to Recent Heavy Snow

Due to schools being closed part of the time on account of the recent snow, 4-H Clubs of the county were unable to meet until Wednesday and Thursday of last week. The principal business transacted had to do with the poultry project which is sponsored by the Home Feed & Fertilizer Company. Rules and requirements were given each 4-H Club boy and girl who expressed a desire to enter the contest. The feed company will furnish each of ten Chowan County 4-H Club members with 100 New Hampshire pullet chicks. The Club member agrees to feed, water and take proper care of the chicks and to bring 12 pullets to a 4-H poultry show and sale which will be held next Fall.

Proceeds from the sale will go to the sponsor to pay for the pullets. The remainder of the pullets will be property of the club member. The club boys and girls who conducted a similar project last year are fortunate in having a good pedigreed laying flock of their own.

Corn, peanut and cotton projects were discussed at a separate meeting with the boys.

Proper Lights Vital Factor For Driving Safety At Night

All Requirements Must Be Met In Inspection Program

Have you ever faced a single on-rushing headlight and uneasily wondered whether the approaching vehicle was a motorcycle or an automobile with one headlight not working? Have you ever tried to drive at night with your own lights so dim you could hardly see the road before you? Then you know how important good lights are to the safety of night driving.

When the Motor Vehicle Mechanical Inspection Lane opens in this area, your vehicle must be able to meet certain specific requirements as far as lighting equipment is concerned.

There are specifications for tail lights, stop lights, parking lights, passing lights and auxiliary lights, which are given here.

The Manual on Motor Vehicle Mechanical Inspection Requirements lists these minimum standards which all motor vehicles must meet in order to be approved:

Tail Lights: "All motor vehicles originally equipped with approved tail light or lights may not in this respect be altered. Such light, or lights, when lighted must exhibit a red light, plainly visible for a distance of not less than 500 feet to the rear."

Don't worry if your car was originally built with only one tail light. It will still pass the test if that one is in good safe condition and is visible for 500 feet to the rear. But if the vehicle was originally equipped with two, then both of them must be operating.

Stop Lights: "All motor vehicles originally equipped with approved stop lights must not in this respect be altered. Such light, or lights, shall present a red signal upon application of the foot brake, plainly visible from a distance of not less than 500 feet to the rear."

Note that this requirement does not state that all vehicles must have stop lights, but it does say that if the car was originally built with them, they must still be in good working order.

Parking Lights: "All motor vehicles shall be equipped with parking lights capable of presenting one or more white lights at the front and one or two red lights at the rear, all of which shall be visible from a distance of not less than 500 feet. All motor vehicles originally equipped with dual front or rear parking lights may not in this respect be altered."

Passing Lights: "All motor vehicles originally equipped with a means for dimming or depressing

headlight beams may not in this respect be altered and such device shall be in good working order."

Auxiliary Lights: "All motor vehicles may be equipped with not to exceed two auxiliary driving lights mounted on the front and must be aimed in such a manner that no part of the high intensity portion of the beam shall be directed to the left of the extreme left side of nor more than 75 feet ahead of the vehicle. The center of the high intensity beam shall not be higher than 8 inches below lamp center at 25 feet."

Auxiliary lights, naturally, are not required. But if your vehicle is equipped with them, they must measure up to the stated specifications. And no vehicle is allowed to have more than two. Any or all unauthorized lights or warning devices shall be removed before the vehicle will be approved.

North Carolina Leads Southern States In Boosting Corn Yield

Average Yield In 1947 Jumps to 32½ Bushels Per Acre

"No other State in the South has a record that will approach ours in the progress in increasing the average corn yield of the State during the past ten years," says assistant County Agent Robert S. Marsh. The statement was made following a meeting of county agents of the Northeastern District. This progress was pointed out by Dr. E. R. Collins of State College, in charge of Extension agronomy.

When the corn program in North Carolina was started ten years ago the average yield was only 22½ bushels per acre, while it was 32½ bushels per acre in 1947. The increase in corn yield has been due to better spacing in rows, better seed bed preparation, good rotations, better cultural methods and by planting adapted hybrids or other adapted varieties which are suited to the locality in which they are planted.

down into the three series the sales were: E Bonds \$867.00 and G Bonds \$8,600.00.

Sales of Savings Bonds for the State of North Carolina for the same period totaled \$6,434,532.00.

In announcing the above county and state sales figures, Mr. Byrum further stated that the citizens of North Carolina as of January 1, 1948 are holding \$650 million dollars in Series E, F and G Savings Bonds, and added that such thrift is something to be proud of and certainly gives us faith in the future, as there is a direct relation between the savings bonds holdings in a county today and the standard of living in the county tomorrow.
