"The executive committee of the North Carolina Council of Churches, having seriously considered the implications of the Supreme Court decision in the McCollum-Champaign case, hereby records its conscientious conviction, with sincere respect for the authority and judgment of our country's highest tribunal, that the obscurity and ambiguity of the Su-preme Court's decision entitle the North Carolina Council of Churches to continue its present program of Bible instruction in the public schools of this state until such time as the implications of this decision have been authoritatively and explicitly clarified beyond any doubt as to their local application."


