conservation practices as planned in sort to the use of deeper rooted crops. their soil conservation farm plans He will use Sericea lespedeza. have consumed the effort and time of Stillman Leary plans to seed a hog quite a number of Chowan's farmers pasture to this crop also. in recent months. Among the practices used for the conservation of water and soil is that of permanent pas-ture improvement. Bob Hollowell, farmer of the Cross Roads area, and member of the Chowan County Board of Soil Conservation Supervisors, began working at the improvement of his permanent pasture last fall. His old pasture had become depleted of recommended species of fertility and infested with a weed pest which he called "hound tongue." His first step in his improvement procedure was to break the land with a disc tiller. The land was allowed to settle for a few weeks, after which it was limed and fertilized. Applications of 4,000 pounds of lime, 1,500 pounds of superphosphate and 30 tons of stable manure were made to the three-acre plot. These applications were thoroughly disced into the soil. Upon waiting for the seedbed to settle, Mr. Hollowell seeded it with a mixture of Kentucky 31 Fescue, white and La-dino clover. Annual lespedeza was seeded on top this spring. Mr. Hollowell has watched this pasture grow and now considers it a fit subject for a picture. He has requested R. C. Jordan, Chowan County Soil Conservationist, to make a picture of it. According to Mr. Hollowell, several of his neighbor farmers have pronounced it "about the best possible undersigned at Edenton, N. C., on or they ever saw." Mr. Jordan states that Mr. Hollowell is the first farmer in Chowan County to use the Kentucky 31 Fescue-Ladino clover seed in the county all persons having claims against the estate of said John R.
