

Prospects Point To 710,000 Bales For State Cotton Crop

Condition of Crop as a Whole Is Reported Good

North Carolina's cotton crop improved materially during August, and production prospects point to 710,000 bales. This is 57 per cent larger than the 1947 crop of 452,000 bales, 22 per cent larger than the 10-year average production and will be the largest crop the State has produced since 1944. Prospective yield of 470 pounds of lint per acre (indicative of nearly a bale per acre) is 135 pounds more than last year's yield, 115 pounds above the 10-year average and the highest yield of record.

Bolls matured rapidly during August and a high percentage of the crop, particularly in southern sections, is open awaiting picking. Harvest is progressing rapidly in southern sections under favorable conditions, and will become active in all coastal and lower Piedmont areas soon.

Over the State as a whole, the crop is uniformly good. Moisture during the growing season was sufficient for good plant development, yet the weather was hot and dry enough to limit weevil activity. Most cotton has completed fruiting — leaving plants with a heavy set of large size bolls.

Auto Department Calls For Safety

Urges Adults and Children to Observe Safety Rules

School bells are ringing again! The Department of Motor Vehicles therefore urges that everybody—children and adults—review the rules of traffic safety.

"With vacation over, and children going back to school, drivers must be extra careful. But all of us must see that the children are as safe as possible on our streets," Col. L. C. Ross, Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, says. "And when I say all of us, that's just what I mean. The safety of our children is a job for the whole community—parents, the police, school officials, teachers, and every club or organization that numbers motorists, parents or young people among its members."

The child safety campaign this month is part of a continuing traffic safety program coordinated in North Carolina by the Department of Motor Vehicles, and sponsored nationally by the National Safety Council.

Back-to-school safety pointers Ross listed are:

1. Motorists, give the kids a "brake" by using special caution in residential areas, school zones and wherever you see them.
2. Parents, see that your children know the safest route to school—and that they know how to behave safely in traffic. And set them a good example.
3. Older boys and girls, watch out for the smaller children. They follow your example, you know—so give them a good one to follow.
4. Younger children, obey your traffic officers and school safety patrols. Keep out of the street except when you cross with the traffic signal, and always cross at the intersection, never in the middle of the block.

Demonstrations In Forestry Under Way On Chowan Farms

Assistance Being Given By State Forester J. C. Jones

Assisted by J. C. Jones, Extension forester, several forestry demonstrations have been started in Chowan County. A selective cutting demonstration was laid out, marked and timber estimate made on one acre. This acre contains about 6,200 board feet of sawlog timber and quite a lot of pulpwood marked to come out. Then a good stand of the best trees will be left to grow. This acre is representative of the twenty acres in this tract of timber.

A one-acre timber stand improvement demonstration was laid out with J. Elton Jordan of Tyner. A visit to Vernon Boyce's woods at Tyner revealed ten acres of young pines much in need of proper thinning and just right for pulpwood. A later date was set to revisit Mr. Boyce, lay off a demonstration plot and mark the trees to be cut for fuel and pulpwood.

J. C. Forehand and Kelly Byrum of Ryland were two 4-H Club members visited and timber management discussed with them in their woods. A beautiful stand of young pines was observed on E. M. Howell's farm near Ryland. It was pointed out to Mr. Howell the numerous hardwoods and poorer pines which should be removed and utilized, leaving ample room for the best trees to grow. A demonstration will probably be laid out here later.
