of investment in life. There is hope and unlimited opportunities."

The speaker referred to splitting of the atom, which he said was the greatest thing since finding the empty tomb. "There is so much power in the atom," he said, "that we do not know how to handle it. We should have men of religion to direct this power in the right direction."

Mr. Nickens said there are three ways in which life can be invested: The way of the miser, the way of the spendthrift and the way of the Master of Men.

"The first," he said, "reflects selfishness, isolationism and a 'big I and little you' attitude. Life's values must be shared, not taking in and giving nothing."

Referring to the spendthrift way, Mr. Nickens said, "We were not put here to hoard nor to be a waster." He cited the prodigal son story, saying that many waste their substance, yet do not go to a far-off country to do it. "Many a man is only a shell of the man he might have been," he said.

The way of the Master of Men was referred to as an investment in usefulness and service. "He went about doing good," said the speaker, "but some just go about and some go about doing harm. Every person should dig a well for use to refresh others long after he or she passes on," and to stress his point Mr. Nickens recited the Bridge Builder poem.

doctors maintain. Unfortunately, tuberculosis has no symptoms in its early stage when it is easiest to cure. But, fortunately, it can be detected early by means of a chest X-ray. Taking chest X-rays is one of the ac-

activities of the local association. The association conducts clinics throughout the year for the discovery of tuberculosis and the subsequent treatment. It is important that treatment begins early; important to isolate active cases to avoid their coming into contact with others; important to examine persons that have been in contact with tubercular persons frequently; important to watch school children who may be underweight or undernourished with the view of building them physically so that they will not become affected by the disease.

All of this work is carried on with the money raised by the sales of these little seals that have been appearing

annually since 1907. Aside from mailing the seals, Miss Paulina Hassell and Fenton Larson will direct the campaign in the white schools and D. F. Walker in the colored schools. Among the colored citizens the Woman's Club will direct the sale. Edenton business firms will be solicited by members of the Junior Woman's Club.
