Farm Cash Receipts Far Above Last Year

\$475,472,000 Realized By Farmers First Eight Months In 1948

North Carolina farmers are receiving more money for both their crop and their livestock enterprises this year, says Moyle S. Williams, farm management specialist at State

Williams asserted that despite the increase in gross income, many North to compensation paid for service-Carolina farmers received lower net connected disability or death. incomes because of an increase in production costs.

"Prospects point to a continuing high cost of production, with the exception of feed costs," Williams said. "Farmers who have been most efficient in use of the factors of production have maintained high net incomes. Prospects for the rest of 1948 and into 1949 emphasize the importance of increased efficiency in North Carolina farms.'


