

# American People Asked To Consume Tons Of Peanuts

## Each Person Requested To Eat a Pound Dur- ing Peanut Week

American people will consume 144,000,000 pounds of peanuts during National Peanut Week, April 3rd through 9th, if the wishes of Ralph McMillan of the Bristow, Oklahoma Peanut Company come true. According to McMillan, who is chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Peanut Council, Atlanta, Ga., this country produced approximately two and one-third billion pounds of peanuts this year, and he asks each citizen of the United States to eat at least a pound during Peanut Week.

This week Mr. McMillan stated that: "I agree with Secretary of Agriculture Charles F. Brannan, who says that American farmers are living on borrowed time. The peanut industry is anxious to cooperate with the Federal government in its farm adjustment program. With the present crop valued at more than \$200,000,000 and the value of next year's crop uncertain, the big job of the industry is to create a greater consumer demand than ever before."

Secretary of Agriculture Brannan said recently that United States agriculture is living on "borrowed time" because high food exports under the Marshall Plan have given farmers a "respite from postwar readjustment."

"Eventually", Brannan said in his annual report to President Truman, "the respite will be over and our farmers will depend on the buying power of individual consumers at home and abroad."

"Adjustment to the change will not be easy."

"I think the time has come to ponder what it may involve."

Brannan said that "ostensibly the agricultural developments resemble those of 1947 and appear to exclude anxiety about surpluses and low prices for most farm products. Each year, however," he added, "brings normal conditions nearer—conditions of lessened world dependency on American farm products."

"It is largely due to Brannan's comprehensive report," said Mr. McMillan, "that the First National Peanut Industry Conference has been called to convene in Washington, D. C., April 10th through 12th, during the same time that the National Peanut Council holds its annual convention, and in connection with it."

"Every association in the peanut industry is expected to be represented there," he said.

# Irregular Prices For Spot Cotton

## Prices Latter Part of Last Week Below Previous Week

Spot cotton prices were irregular during last week and on Friday averaged slightly lower than a week earlier. Trading in the ten spot markets was generally less active with the volume of sales smaller than during the previous week. The February parity price for cotton of 30.38 cents per pound showed a drop of 37 points when compared with January.

Prices for middling 15/16 inch cotton in the ten markets averaged 32.66 cents per pound on Friday, March 4, as compared with 32.74 a week earlier and 33.97 a year ago. Reported sales in the ten markets during the week totaled 114,100 bales as compared with 147,900 in previous week and 108,300 in the corresponding week a year ago.
