

### Two Audiences Hear Missionary's Lecture

Miss Nollie McDonald  
Speaks at School and  
Presbyterian Church

Miss Nollie K. McDonald, a missionary from the Southern Presbyterian Mission Center at Belgian Congo, Africa, addressed a group of more than 400 pupils and teachers of the Edenton school in the school auditorium Thursday morning. Highlighting the address was a series of colored slides portraying the homes, food, work, and natural every day living of the natives with whom she has worked for the past three years as matron in one of the mission centers in the heart of the Belgian Congo.

Following the lecture, Miss McDonald showed a number of products from that region, many of which were woven from the bark strippings of palm trees which the natives use entirely for cloth and other necessary things.

Among Miss McDonald's prize collection from the Congo were hand-carved ivory elephants, a native costume, bracelets, hats, a priceless hand-carved miniature Pyramid and a miniature Sphinx, made from genuine alabaster stone.

The collection also included a warrior's knife as worn on dress occasions by the natives, which was a gift to Miss McDonald by Lukenga, king of the Congo, who is the proud possessor of more than 300 wives. Miss McDonald stated that about 80 of these wives have become Christians.

On Sunday evening Miss McDonald repeated her lecture to an appreciative audience at the Edenton Presbyterian Church.

Miss McDonald, a sister of Mrs. R. E. Leary, is now on leave of absence from the mission, but expects to return in September to take up her duties as a medical missionary and X-ray technician. She is a graduate of Woman's College in Greensboro.
