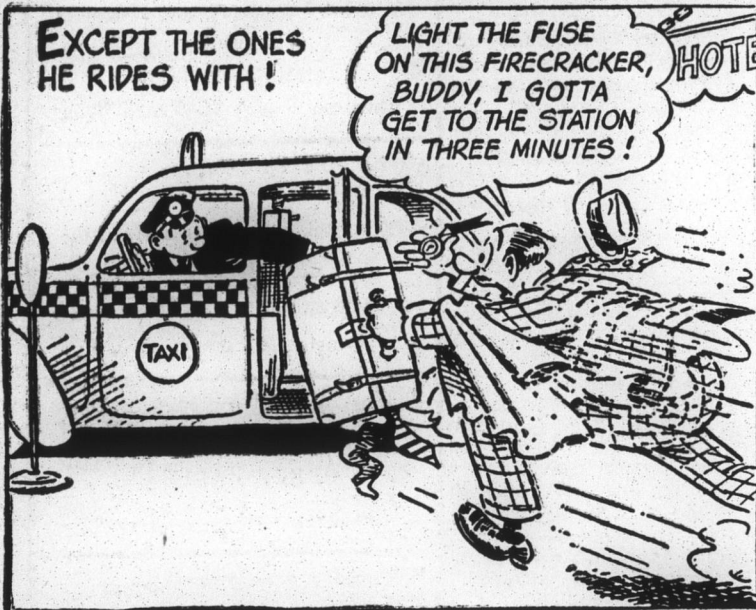

Red Men Tribe Moves Into Own Building

First Time In History Local Tribe Owned Own Hall

Chowan Tribe of Red Men on Monday night met in their own new home on Broad Street next to the Broad Street Fish Market, and the large number of members in attendance were delighted that for the first time in the history of the tribe, it has a home owned by the tribe.

The building some months ago was purchased from Ernest Kehayes, and was practically rebuilt from top to bottom and an extension added at the rear of the building. In the very near future the Red Men plan to stage a special meeting to dedicate the new home and meeting place.

The lower floor has been leased to R. S. Walraven.

Vets' Question Box

Q.—I wish to convert my National Service Life Insurance. Do I get credit for all the money I paid on my term insurance?

A.—No, because the premiums paid on your term insurance were required to pay for the cost of the protection afforded. If you convert now, you must pay the full premium required at your attained age for the converted insurance.

Q.—I just received my NSLI policy but I notice the beneficiary is not endorsed on it. Why is this?

A.—NSLI policies do not show the beneficiary or the option chosen by the insured. When you designated your beneficiary the form you signed was made part of your records. If the designations were endorsed on your policy, it would not necessarily be accurate at a later date, since you can change your designation without sending in your policy to be corrected.

Q.—May I name anyone as beneficiary of my insurance?

A.—Yes. You may designate any person or persons, firm, corporation or other legal entity, including your estate.

Q.—I now have \$5,000 National Service Life Insurance in force. I did have another \$5,000 NSLI policy, but surrendered it for cash. May I apply for a new \$5,000 NSLI policy to bring the total amount up to \$10,000, which I understand is the maximum coverage obtainable?

A.—No. NSLI surrendered for cash may not be replaced. By surrendering your \$5,000 NSLI policy you gave up your entitlement to that amount of National Life Insurance.

Q.—I have recently developed a skin condition and would like to receive out-patient treatment by VA. Is this possible?

A.—Eligibility for out-patient treatment must be determined by VA. The condition must be determined to have been incurred in, or aggravated by, active military or naval service before out-patient treatment can be authorized.

Q.—What veterans are entitled to receive automobiles from the Government?

A.—Veterans who have suffered the loss, or loss of use, of one or both legs as the result of a disability incurred in active service during World War II are entitled to automobiles.

BONDS CALLED

The Secretary of the Treasury has announced that all outstanding 2 per cent Treasury Bonds of 1949-51, dated May 15, 1942, are called for redemption on September 15, 1949. There are now outstanding \$1,292,443,600 of these bonds.

Bufflap, it is ordered that the clerk be authorized to insert an advertisement in The Chowan Herald once a week for four successive weeks giving notice of a meeting to be held on June 14th, 1949, for the purpose of considering the adoption of an ordinance to annex the area known as Albemarle Court to the territory included in the city limits and likewise consider the annexation of the old railroad right-of-way lying between the present city limits and the west boundary of the S. E. Morris property.

On motion of J. P. Partin, seconded by Clyde Hollowell, the Electric & Water Department is requested to place a street light on Granville Street in front of P. H. Capehart's store, also North Granville Street in front of State Highway Shop.

On motion of J. C. Leary, seconded by J. P. Partin, parking on Gale Street between Broad and Granville Street is to be on the south side of street only. For violation of this ordinance, a fine of \$1.00 is imposed.

On motion of J. E. Bufflap, seconded by J. C. Leary, E. & W. Department bills amounting to \$11,514.15 are ordered paid.
