Peter Carlton Conducts Groups on Historical Tours

According to Peter A. Carlton, manager of the Chamber of Commerce and director of tours for the organization, considerable interest has been shown by teachers and students from all over the State in touring the interesting spots of the historical town of Edenton. Students and teachers have come from Charlotte, Swan Quarter, Greenville, Wilson, Hertford, Creswell, Norfolk and other places.

On Thursday of last week Mr. Carlton conducted a tour consisting of 45 students of the fifth grade of the Central School in Elizabeth City. Plans had been made with Mrs. Eva S. Temple, teacher of the group, to meet the students at 9:45 at the Municipal Building in Edenton, from where the visitors began their trip. Mr. Carlton states that it is always a joy to conduct tours for school children because they seem so eager and enthusiastic to listen and to enjoy everything that is seen and heard.

More and more teachers are making use of the practical field trips to historical spots in Edenton, enrich the background of their students and to tie in the classroom work with on the spot observations.

Over 25,000 Licenses Issued During April

Revenue For State During Month Amounts To \$47,045.86

A total of 25,037 driver's licenses were issued in April, bringing to 512,000 the number issued since the pro-

gram was begun in July, 1947, the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles has announced.

Of the April figure, 21,000 were operator's licenses granted on new applications; 1,680 were duplicates on old applications and 1,314 were duplicates on new applications. Nine hundred and fifty-seven chauffeurs' licenses, valid for the remainder of the fiscal year, were issued along with 85 duplicates.

Net revenue from issuance of licenses was \$47,045.86, of which \$43,469 was from original operators' licenses, \$1,607.61 from duplicate operators' licenses; \$1,922.75 from original chauffeur's licenses and \$46.50 from duplicate chauffeurs' licenses.

Profit In Cabbage, Says Negro Farmer

There are good profits in cabbage production, says Joseph Richardson, Negro farmer of Essex, Warren County.

According to county Agent, C. S. Wynn of the State College Extension Service, Richardson has 0.8 acre of land set in cabbage this year. He planted the crop around the first of December, using 1500 pounds of 3-10-6 fertilizer. Since he and his wife did the 12 hours of work required in preparing the land and planting the crop, there was no labor bill.

To date Richardson has sold 6,000 pounds of cabbage at three and one-half cents a pound, a total of \$210. His cabbage average about four or five cents a head. Approximately one-fourth of his crop is still on hand.

In order to make the best use of his land, Richardson has planted cotton between the cabbage rows. When all of the cabbage crop has been harvested, cotton will be growing in the field.

11,294 Farmers Attend Annual Tobacco Schools

A series of schools held earlier this year for North Carolina tobacco farmers proved to be unusually successful from the standpoint of both attendance and interest, reports R. R. Bennett, extension tobacco specialist at State College.

A total of 11,294 farmers attended the schools, which were held in 69 counties. Of the 108 meetings, 71 were held in 48 counties for both the White and the Negro farmers with an attendance of 1,857; 24 were held in 24 counties for Negro farmers only with an attendance of 1,857; and 13 on burley production were held in nine counties with an attendance of 525. The schools were conducted by Bennett and S. N. Hawks, Jr., assistant extension tobacco specialists. The

most important point emphasized was the need for producing high-quality other parts of the world. Other subjects discussed were varieties, fertilization, curing, diseases, insects, top-ping, spacing, and marketing.
