Four County Health District Will Have Trained Technician

Laboratory Scheduled to Be Used For Full **Time Service**

NEW WORKERS

J. L. Batts Added as the **Third Sanitarian For** District

According to Dr. B. B. McGuire, health officer for the Pasquotank-Camden-Perquimans-Chowan Health District, the annual budget recently approved by the District Board of Health provides for the employment of a well trained laboratory technician for full time service at the Health Center in Elizabeth City. Heretofore, only two hours service monthly has been provided and this was for milk analysis only.

"Your health center has a good laboratory that can just as well be used for full time service for the four counties in this health district and for nearby counties as well," says Dr. McGuire.

"Most of the laboratory work here has been performed by the State Laboratory in Raleigh. This local service will start as soon as a trained technician can be hired. The laboratory work in venereal diseases, bangs disease, poliomyelitis, tuberculosis, malaria, intestinal parasites, more frequent milk analysis, water analysis, funds are set aside for this purpose




