Licenses During June

Without License Subject to Arrest

A total of 58,340 licenses to drive were issued during June to operators Injured through July 22, 1949___3,855 the Department of Motor Vehicles announced today.

Operators' licenses numbered 44,000, bringing to 581,000 the number issued since the re-issuance program began. All H through K drivers were required to stand re-examination by June 30 and all drivers of commercial vehicles were to get new licenses for the fiscal year by that date. Approximately 39,000 commercial drivers operate in the State but only 14,540 chauffeurs' licenses for 1949-50 had been issued on the last day of June. A total of 11,789 were issued in June. All H through K drivers apprehended without new licenses will be subject to arrest. All chauffeurs without new licenses or receipts showing they have applied for the licenses also will be subject to arrest.
