She stated that the bloodmobile would arrive in front of the Armory possibly at nine o'clock on November 15th. This mobile will be driven by

custodians. Six nurses and one doctor will arrive in a car following the bloodmobile. All equipment used will be brought in the mobile so that all that is required of the local chapter is 150 pounds of ice, food for the donors and, of course the donors. Blood will be taken from 10 o'clock in the morning until 4 o'clock in the afternoon. Six donors will be taken every 15 minutes.

J. M. Boyce, recruitment chairman, announced that already 35 pledges had been made. Everyone in this community will be contacted but in event someone is not contacted and wishes to pledge, may sign pledge cards at Leggett & Davis Drug Store, Mitchener, or the Triangle Filling Station. Pledge cards will be available at all three places at all times and the management will be glad to help you. A deadline of November 5 has been set for all pledges. One week previous to the mobile visit of the 15th, volunteers may call the Armory, phone 248.

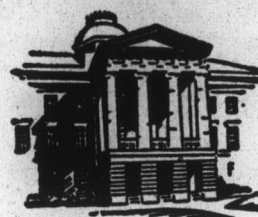
