
## CAMPER'S CABIN AT CAMP DON-LEE

# **Veterans Unaware** Of Free Treatment

## J. L. Wiggins Ready to Aid Vets to Secure **Applications**

Many North Carolina veterans being treated regularly by their own physicians for service-connected ailments at their own expense are unaware that they are entitled to such treatments at government expense.

This benefit applies to only those veterans who have filed a claim and have been granted service-connection for a disability even though they did not receive a compensable rating for compensation.

A large number of veterans have been granted a service - connected "zero" rating making them ineligible to receive compensation but entitling them to out-patient treatment at government expense.

Veterans who have no compensable rating but have established serviceconnection and who desire treatment good will toward men." at other than their own expense are

If started in time, this treatment will prevent the needles from drying out and becoming flammable, and will keep them fresh and green.
