Insurance Dividends Paid To Veterans

A few World War veterans eligible for dividends on their Government Life Insurance already have received checks it is announced by Stephen H. Alford, District Officer of the North Carolina Veterans Commission.

Mr. Alford warned, however, that World War I veterans are not eligible for the dividends unless they have retained their insurance since they were in the service. Very few of the older group have kept up their payments.

It is not necessary for World War I men to apply for their dividends, he said. The Veterans Administration has the records, and the checks will be sent to them automatically.

Meanwhile dividend checks for World War II veterans holding National Service Life Insurance still are being awaited. Mailing of the checks was scheduled to begin January 16, and the last check will probably be mailed about three months later.

The revenue from the sale of these school sites to be applied on the debt service of Chowan County.
