

Request Made For State To Take Over Impassable Road

Commissioners Agree to Ask State to Maintain B Lane

Several Negro men who live on B Lane, a road leading from the Suffolk highway on the Griffin farm appeared before the County Commissioners Monday in an effort to secure approval to a request for the State to take over the road.

More than enough houses are on the road to warrant State maintenance and 14 children are compelled to use the road to go to school. At times the road is impassable, so that even a doctor cannot reach the houses to attend the sick.

The Commissioners agreed that the road should be made passable and, therefore, recommended that the State take over the road, which is about a mile long.

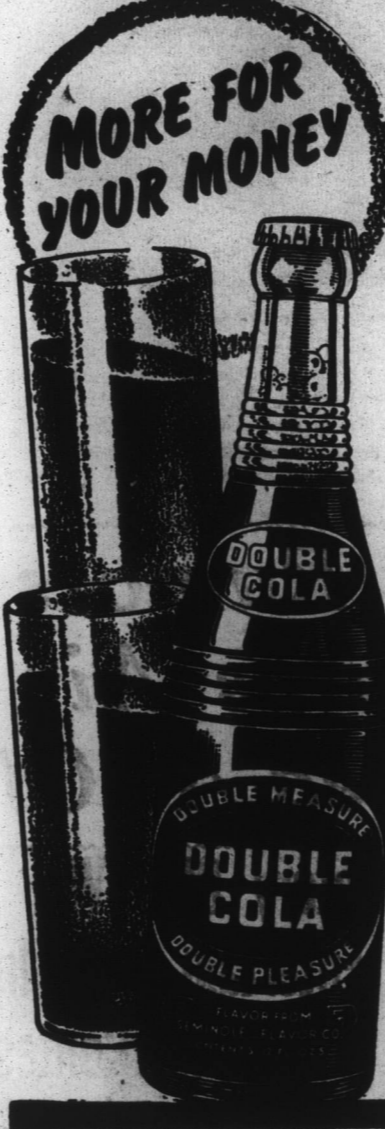
