

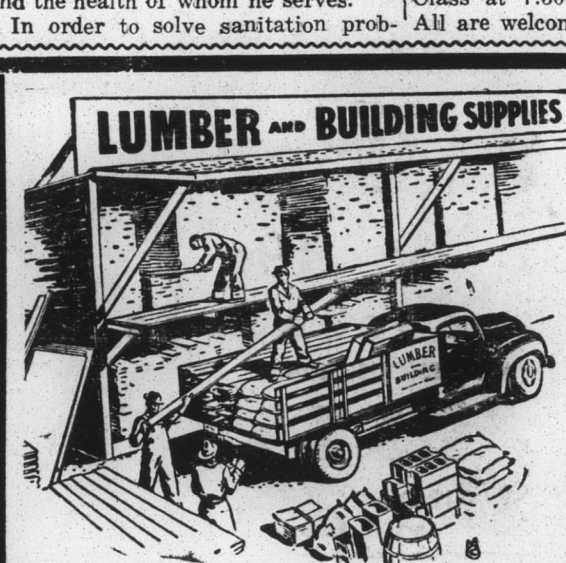
## Foodhandlers School Is Designed To Solve Sanitation Problems

### Necessary to Apply and Understand Scientific Knowledge

As an official agency charged with the responsibility of protecting and promoting the public health, the Pasquotank-Perquimans-Camden-Chowan District Health Department is attempting to discharge its responsibility by developing a program planned with the people and designed to meet their needs. Cooperative planning to be effective in problem solving must be based on public understanding followed with individual group participation. Increasing numbers of people eating out, together with the rapid turnover of foodhandling personnel, is making the problem of adequate protection for the public more acute and complex.

The District Health Department's staff felt that as a public health agency they had a greater responsibility in alleviating the problem than just the routine sanitary inspection of public eating places. Obviously the paramount need is for foodhandlers to understand and to be able to apply the scientific knowledge available on the various means of transmission of disease in public eating places. This need could be met only through teamwork among the Health Department, management, and employees. Lack of participation on the part of anyone would affect the efforts of the others. The Health Department could provide the technical information and with the help of the other two groups could better protect the public's health through the continuous application of this knowledge. Management could improve the appearance and services of foodhandling establishments by utilizing the assistance and guidance offered by the Health Department.

The foodhandler through this cooperative effort develops a sense of personal responsibility as he learns and understands the basic rules of health and sanitation necessary for the safeguarding of his own health and the health of whom he serves.

## Chickens, Eggs Head Food List

### Miss Rebecca Colwell Points Out Plentiful Foods

Broilers and fryers, eggs, and dried beans and peas are "February Firsts" on the U. S. Department of Agriculture's monthly list of foods plentiful on Southern markets, Miss Rebecca Colwell, home demonstration agent for the State College Extension Service, said this week.

More broilers and fryers are being sold now than last year, she explained, and USDA statistics indicate marketings should stay above last year from now until March 1. Warmer weather, larger laying flocks, and increased egg production per hen are the main factors in the egg supply increase expected in February.

Last season's dried bean production was a record, and stocks of most dried peas are ample for all consumer demands, Miss Colwell said. Fresh vegetables for the month—beets, cabbage, carrots, lettuce, spinach, and especially spring greens—will be plentiful on Southern markets in February, she added. Canned and frozen corn are listed as the best buy in canned foods.

Tree nuts—mainly almonds, walnuts, and filberts—are plentiful, and as for fruits, Miss Colwell said, best supplies would be found in apples, oranges, winter pears, cranberries, raisins, and dried prunes.

Additional foods on the February plentiful foods list, the home agent said, are turkeys, pork and pork products, manufactured dairy products, and frozen fish.

## 162 People In Chowan Get Old Age Assistance

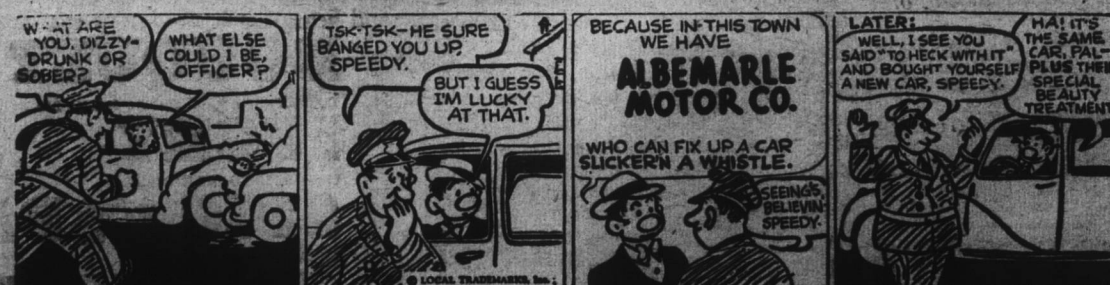
