

Fourth Graders Hear Address By English Nurse

Mrs. Elizabeth Corbett Delights Miss Jones' Pupils

Speaking colorfully, and with deep interest, Mrs. Elizabeth Corbett, British nurse of the Chowan Hospital staff, kept 39 boys and girls of Miss Lena Jones' fourth grade noticeably alerted and interested as she related her adventures across the Atlantic Ocean, 18 months ago, aboard the Queen Mary.

Mrs. Corbett, a native of London, England, who having been the head of an orphanage with more than 280 children in her charge during the recent war, made herself perfectly at home with the small children to whom she talked on Thursday afternoon in their class room at the Edenton school.

Displaying her passport, and explaining why photographs and fingerprints were required, brought up quite an interesting round table discussion among the listeners. Also on display was a treasured collection of British coins which reached a high peak of interest when many children told of their own collections of foreign coins which were given them by relatives who were in the warring countries during recent years.

When asked to relate some of the war incidents of which Mrs. Corbett has experienced, she humorously replied, in her soft spoken well poised manner, "Well, as long as we could hear the bombs whistling through the air, we were told not to worry. It is when you can't hear the noise of them that they are getting ready to explode and do the damage."

"I will add this to my answer to your questions," Mrs. Corbett said, "When your boys came to our rescue, we felt quite safe and well guarded by such stout-hearted, steadfast boys on our territory."

The speaker promised to make a return visit with the class sometime in the not too far off future.

P & Q Food Center's MEAL OF THE WEEK

- Hamburger Patties
- French Fried Potatoes
- Creamed Cauliflower
- Pickled Beet Salad
- Marble Cake (Recipe below)

NOTE: Starched items (meal-of-the-week specials) in ad will make this meal.

Marble Cake

- 1 1/2 teaspoons melted vegetable shortening
- 1 1/2 tablespoons cocoa
- 1 1/2 tablespoons warm water
- 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons sifted cake flour
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/4 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup soft vegetable shortening
- 1/2 cup Fat Milk
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 unbeaten egg
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

Turn on oven; set at moderately slow (350° F.). Grease a medium loaf pan. Mix melted shortening, cocoa and warm water. Sift flour into bowl with sugar, baking powder and salt. Add soft shortening and 1/2 of a mixture of milk, water and vanilla. Beat 2 minutes with spoon or electric beater at medium speed. Add remaining 1/2 of milk mixture and egg. Beat 2 minutes longer. Pour about 3/4 of batter into greased pan. Stir soda into cocoa mixture. Beat into remaining 1/4 of batter. Spoon over light batter. Cut through batter in zig-zag pattern with knife. Bake 40 minutes, or until cake shrinks from sides of pan. Cool. Spread with chocolate frosting, if desired.
