(Continued from Page One) the proper calibre. However, it was the general concensus of opinion that a full-time secretary is desired, but in view of the apparent inability to meet a budget necessary to employ such a man, the next best arrangement is a part-time secretary.

The proposal was also made that in view of the fact that a properly functioning Chamber of Commerce benefits the town as a whole, a request be made for a special election to secure financial aid from the Town, which in the final analysis means that every taxpayer would be taking

on the whole reflected a strong desire to continue operation of the Chambe of Commerce, an effort will be mad to collect dues in arrears and also revamp the system of charging dues in the hope that more interest and more members will result.


