

Cancer Clinics Held Every Friday At E. City Health Center

Purpose Is to Encourage Look-out for Cancer Symptoms

Clinics at the Northeastern Carolina Cancer Detection Center are held every Friday afternoon in the Health Center Elizabeth City, with registration from 1 to 2:30 P. M. These examinations are free to all women 35 or over, all men 40 or over, and to anyone with a symptom or a "danger signal," regardless of age.

The Northeastern Carolina Cancer Detection Center is under the management of the Pasquotank Medical Society, and frequently there are more applicants for examination than can be accommodated. Therefore, in order that those who live at a distance may be sure of an examination and thus not make a trip in vain, priorities will be sent on request, to all who live 20 miles or more from Elizabeth City. Requests should be addressed to Cancer Center Clerk, Health Center, corner Cedar and Harney streets, and indicate two dates on which the visit can be made.

A group of Elizabeth City women volunteer their time each Friday afternoon to serve as receptionists and volunteers nurses' aides. The purpose is to urge people to have an examination and to encourage them to be on the look-out for cancer symptoms while they are in the early stage. It is hoped many in the district will avail themselves of the opportunity to be examined.

HONOR ROLL CITIES



Bonner's Dried Peaches box 25c	RECIPE OF THE WEEK By Mary Lee Taylor Raisin Tapioca Pudding Broadcast: May 13, 1950 1 egg, separated 1/2 cup brown sugar 2 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca few grains salt 3/4 cup water 1/2 cup Pet Milk 1/4 cup seedless raisins 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 marshmallows, halved 2 teaspoons jelly Beat egg white until stiff, but not dry. Beat in 1/4 cup brown sugar. Mix in saucepan the tapioca, 1/4 cup brown sugar, the salt and water. Boil over low heat 5 min., or until tapioca is clear and thick. Stir in slowly a mixture of slightly beaten egg yolk, milk and raisins. Stir to a boil over low heat, then boil and stir 30 seconds longer. Take off heat; add vanilla. Fold in egg-white mixture. Put into 4 dessert dishes. Chill. At serving time, garnish with marshmallow halves. Top each marshmallow with equal parts of jelly.
