

**Raisin Tapioca Pudding** 

Broadcast: May 13, 1950

We grains salt

24, cup water

2 teaspoons jelly

Beat egg white until stiff, but not dry.

Beat in 1/4 cup brown sugar. Mix in saucepan the tapioca, 1/4 cup brown sugar, the salt and water. Boil over low heat 5 min., or until tapioca is clear and thick. Stir in slowly a mixture of slightly beaten egg yolk, milk and raisins. Stir to a boil over low heat, then boil and stir 30 seconds longer. Take off heat; add vanilla. Fold in egg-white mixture. Put into 4 dessert dishes. Chill. At serving time, garnish with marshmallow halves. Top each marshmallow with equal parts of jelly.
