Experienced teacher, Chowan County historian with membership in several historical societies, and President of the Business and Professional Women's Club of Edenton. Below are four points in support of her candidacy:

"1. To exert my efforts, if elected, to finding means of keeping the children in school until high school graduation, and thus give the State better equipped citizens, and the taxpayers value received for the money spent on public education. The recent survey of the State Education Commission shows that only half of the children entering the first grade will get to the ninth grade, and only half of those who get that far will graduate.

"2. To study carefully each issue for proposed legislation, keep you informed of such proposals through the medium of the press and your clubs, ask for your opinions, and represent you on the basis of what seems to be the majority of opinions; believing as did those delegates to the 1776 Halifax Convention that: 'All political power is vested in and derived from the people only.' In this way I hope to get all people interested in their government's affairs.

"3. To maintain or improve necessary existing services, such as schools, roads, bridges, etc., rendered by the State or increase those services as your opinions would dictate, and at the same time eliminate any waste, of which through you and by my own study I can learn, and furnish these services to you with plans designed to get the most for the tax dollar.

"4. To encourage and promote women's responsibility to their government, to the end that they, who are tax payers, wage earners, and in the majority in directing the children in the homes, schools and churches, might have their thoughts and ideals represented in government."
