

Farm Safety Week Planned In July Rural People Asked to Learn and Observe Safety Rules

The State College Extension Service will cooperate in observance of National Farm Safety Week, July 23-29, as proclaimed by President Truman, the local County Agent said this week.

"Goal of National Farm Safety Week," said the county agent, "is to encourage rural people to learn and observe farm safety rules. Most accidents in 1949 involved some violation of a common-sense safety rule. If the toll of accidents is to be held down this year, all members of farm families must become familiar with the rules of safety in the home, at work, in traffic, and at play. And they must practice these rules every day of the year."

Accidents will kill an average of 48 American farm residents every day during the next 12 months unless extra precautions are taken, according to the National Safety Council.

The County Agent said special local programs are being planned throughout the State in observance of the special week.
