

**Tourist Homes In State Show Increase**

A gain of 22 per cent in North Carolina tourist accommodations over 1949 is shown by a survey just completed by the State Information Division. The survey, based on listings in the "Collins Tourist Handbook of North Carolina," was published in cooperation with the State Advertising Division, shows more than 20,000 rooms available to guests in the coastal, mountain and Mid-South resort areas of the State.

Greatest increase in facilities was shown by Motor Courts, whose capacity is now 60 per cent greater than in 1949.

Rates published in the Guide show few changes from last year. The price range is from \$1.50 to \$12 a day single European Plan, and from \$3 to \$16 single American Plan. Double rates range from \$4 to \$22 European Plan, and from \$6 to \$32 a day American Plan. Weekly rates generally are lower.

The Collins Handbook is now on sale at 25c a copy at hotels and newsstands in the State. It may be obtained by mail from The Collins Company, P. O. Box 542, Winston-Salem, N. C., with discounts on quantity orders.
