

Local Group Hears Great Incohonee Talk

Red Men and Pocahontas Attend Elizabeth City Meeting

William E. Farrenkopf, Great Incohonee of the United States, highest officer of the Improved Order of Red Men, visited North Carolina tribes and councils of Pocahontas at a special meeting held in the Red Men's hall in Elizabeth City Friday night. Two hundred members of the IORM and Degree of Pocahontas attended the meeting, which was the climax of a statewide membership drive. The Elizabeth City degree teams conferred the degree on candidates for membership. Mr. Farrenkopf made an inspiring

speech on "Americanism Versus Socialism and Communism." He explained that the IORM is a fraternity built on the theme of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Members are pledged in this fraternity to bring peace, happiness, freedom, friendship and charity to members, their friends and families. He pointed out that Americanism, our heritage to hand our children, is ours for the taking. We think nothing of it until shots are fired. Then we send our boys to retrieve the heritage we have not defended. Saying "America is the last foothold of democracy and peace," Mr. Farrenkopf urged his fraternal members to give all the support they can and use all their strength to make America stronger. He stressed the fact that there are 163,000 members of the order who can wipe out the work of the 50,000 Communists in the United States. He concluded his speech by saying, "The Degree of Pocahontas has the greatest opportunity to help this effort by giving their sons to the Improved Order of Red Men and their daughters to the Degree of Pocahontas, thus making these orders stronger."
