

Members Of Bar In Favor Amendments

Pass Resolution at Their Meeting Held In Washington

Members of the First District Bar Association, at a meeting held in Washington, N. C., on October 18, went on record as adopting a resolution, favoring the passage of five amendments to the Constitution of North Carolina; these amendments will be voted on in the general election on November 7.

The first amendment will permit a defendant, when represented by counsel, to waive indictment to all except capital cases; the second amendment is designed to restrict the use of funds of teachers and state employees retirement system to the purpose of the retirement system. Amendment three provides for the increase of pay of the members of the General Assembly to \$15 per day, not to exceed 90 days; Amendment four, provides that the number of Judicial Districts may be increased or decreased, and for the election of one or more Superior Court Judges for each district; Amendment five will provide for the selection of Special judges not assigned to any judicial district, and defining their jurisdiction and providing for their compensation.

The First District Bar Association, according to the resolution released by A. P. Godwin, secretary, believes that the passage of each of these amendments will promote general interest and public welfare of the citizens of the State and the Association recommends to the voters of the district that they vote in favor of each of the proposed amendments.

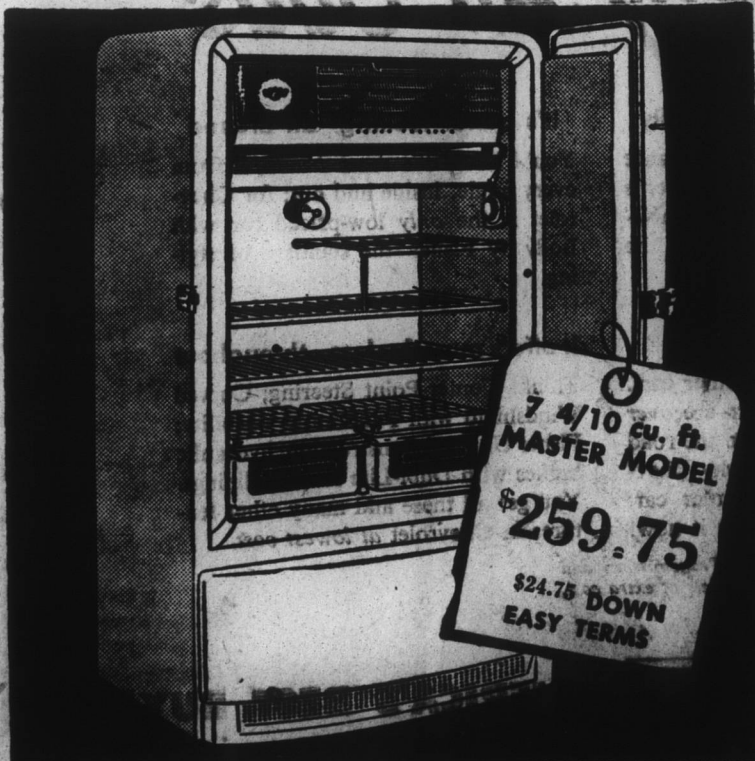

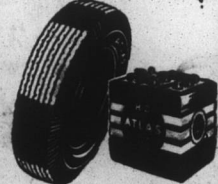
