"Widows of veterans of World War I whose income is \$1,000 or less a year are entitled to a pension of \$42 a month from the Federal Govern ment," Mr. Caldwe!l points out.

Those widows with children under certain ages are entitled to extra compensation provided their income is not over \$2,500 per year.

Service by the veteran must have been between April 6, 1917, and November 11, 1918, and discharge or release from active duty must have been under other than dishonorable conditions after 90 days or more of military service.

For the purposes of a pension a widow must have been married to a World War I veteran before December 14, 1944, or 10 or more years to the person who served and must not have remarried.

District services officers of the North Carolina Veterans Commission, county veterans service officers and post service officers of the various veterans organizations are ready to assist or advise veterans or their dependents on all pension or compensation benefits, and a special campaign is being conducted by the North Carolina Veterans Commission and the county veterans service officers and the post service officers of all the various veterans organizations from September 15 to December 15 to locate and help all such eligible widows and orphans to file their claims properly.
