

Miss Betty Bobbitt Weds R. D. Dixon, Jr.

Wedding Solemnized in Raleigh Church Friday Evening

The marriage of Miss Betty Anne Bobbitt, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Samuel Leslie Bobbitt of Raleigh, to Richard Dillard Dixon, Jr., son of Judge and Mrs. Dixon of Edenton, was solemnized in a formal ceremony Friday evening at 8:30 in the First Baptist Church of Raleigh.

The Rev. Fred A. Bobbitt of Norfolk, Va., uncle of the bride, and Dr. Broadus E. Jones, pastor of the church, were the officiating ministers.

Dr. Harry Cooper, church organist, played the traditional wedding marches, and Miss Jennie Lee Bradford of Suffolk, Va., classmate of the bride at Hollins College, sang.

Psalms and cathedral candles were used at the altar.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, wore a wedding gown of old ivory with off-the-shoulder neckline trimmed with a bertha of antique duchess and rose point lace. Her full skirt extended into a long circular train. Her veil of old ivory illusion was trimmed with antique duchess lace, and it extended the full length of the train. The bride carried a cascade of lilies of the valley, fleur d'amour, and white phalaenopsis orchids, and large cream-colored hybrid cattleya orchids tied with ivory colored satin ribbons and streamers.

Miss Nancy Bobbitt was her sister's maid of honor. to list, sale for taxes due. Commissioners would be empowered to raise jurors fees as high as \$8 a day if HB 239 becomes law. Under HB 207 clerks to superior court would be relieved of having to make an annual report of all public funds in their care if an acceptable CPA report is obtained. SB 35, enlarging the power of town policemen to permit them to carry prisoners to and from jails outside the corporate limits and to attend court outside town, has been ratified. The bill to submit to the people a constitutional amendment to raise the county general fund tax limit from 15c to 20c on the \$100 valuation (HB 174) remains in committee hands. A local bill to allow Guilford County to purchase fire-fighting equipment and sell or lend it to voluntary rural fire-fighting companies should be of general interest. Another local bill requires bondsmen in Swain County to deposit \$1,000 with the superior court clerk before they can furnish bonds in criminal actions in that county.

Social Security
Teachers and state employees who have left their contributions in the retirement system and who have sufficient years service would be per-

mitted by HB 273 to retire before age 60 on either a deferred or immediate allowance. Of interest both to state and local officials is HB 274 which sets up the machinery by which employees of the state and any of its political subdivisions could be brought under the federal security plan.

Election Laws
Sb 109, calculated to abolish use of the absentee ballot in general elections for all except service men and disabled veterans, is having a difficult time. It is now in the hands of a subcommittee for study; chances for a favorable report are poor. If HB 266 passes, second primaries would be eliminated where the leading candidate receives as much as 45% of the total vote in races for congressional and state constitutional offices.


