

Most Self-Employed Required To Enroll For Social Security

Recent Amendment Includes About Five Million Persons

Recent amendments to the Social Security Law extend coverage to about five million self-employed persons. What does this mean to you? It means if you are one of this number, you will have to pay an additional tax on your earned net income for the year 1951 and thereafter. It also means that you will be entitled to all benefits provided by the Old-Age and Survivors' Insurance provision of the Social Security Act.

Income derived from the practice of the Ministry of any church or from the performance of the duties of any religious order cannot be considered for the purpose of this law. Income derived from the practice of their profession by any of the following professional men or women is excluded: physician, lawyer, dentist, osteopath, veterinarian, chiropractor, naturopath, optometrist, architect, certified public accountant, licensed or full-practicing accountant, Christian Science practitioner, professional engineer, or funeral director. Income derived from the operation of a farm is also excluded. Generally speaking, all other self-employed persons are affected.

The tax imposed for Old-Age and Survivors' Insurance is 2 1/2% for the years 1951, 1952 and 1953. This tax applies to net income from self-government if it is \$400 or more a year, with the maximum of \$3,600 in any one taxable year. It will be assessed at the same time that income tax returns are filed. Except in some rare instances, you will not have this to pay until your income tax return for the year 1951 is filed in the early part of 1952. Full information regarding this tax will soon be available from the office of the Collector of Internal Revenue for this district.

If you are a self-employed person and are not specifically excluded by the law, coverage is compulsory. You will need a social security account number before you file your first return. If you already have a social security card, you will use the one you have. If you have worked for wages and have wage credits with the Social Security Administration these will be combined with your self-employment income credits in determining the amount of your social security benefits at a later date. Full information about benefits can be obtained from the nearest office of the Social Security Administration.

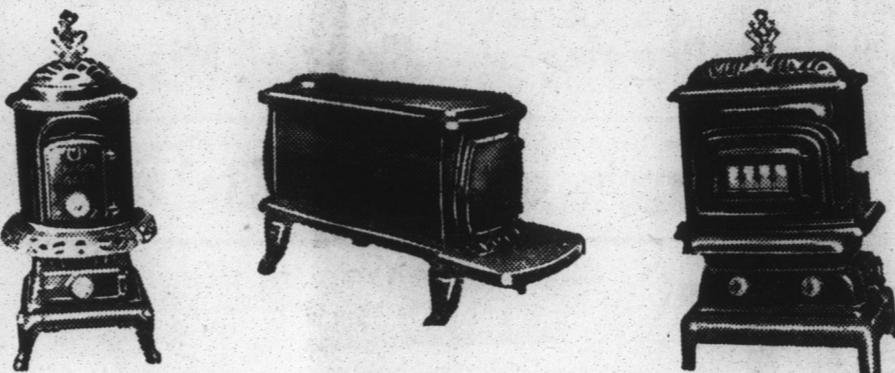
