

Pre-School Clinics In Health District

White School Schedule Will Be Held After School Closes

The District Health Department is carrying out a schedule of pre-school clinics in the district, with the Elizabeth City colored schools and the Edenton white schools to be held after school closes.

Immunization of all children who are to enter school for the first time this fall should be started at once. State Law requires that they be immunized against diphtheria, whooping cough and smallpox before entering school.

Your private doctor will be glad to give all of these, as well as the booster dose for diphtheria and whooping cough in cases where the children were immunized in early childhood," says Dr. B. B. McGuire, district health officer.

"For those children whose parents cannot pay their private doctor, these immunizations may be had free at your county health office. If your private doctor does the immunizations, please ask him to give you a certificate and be sure to bring this certificate to the pre-school clinic.

Our list of children will not be complete. It is impossible for us to get a complete list, and for that reason, please be sure to bring your child to the clinic regardless of whether or not you get a letter from us."
