

Manly Taylor Killed In Auto Accident

Funeral For Bertie Man Held at Capehart's Monday

Manly Hartwell Taylor, 25, of Merry Hill, died in the Albemarle Hospital, Elizabeth City, Sunday morning as the result of injuries received Saturday night when he lost control of his 1950 Ford and turned over on a Currituck highway.

With Taylor at the time of the accident was Raleigh Frank Hughes, 23, also of Merry Hill, who was more fortunate and escaped with minor injuries.

Surviving the deceased man are his wife, Mrs. Anita Wampler Taylor; two stepchildren, Virginia Wampler and Andrew Wampler; parents, Mr. and Mrs. Speight Taylor; two sisters, Mrs. Edward Bunch, Edenton, Linda Kay Taylor, Merry Hill; a brother, Bruce W. Taylor, Merry Hill.

Funeral services were held at Capehart's Baptist Church Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock, with the pastor, the Rev. H. P. Huggins, officiating. Interment was made in the church cemetery.

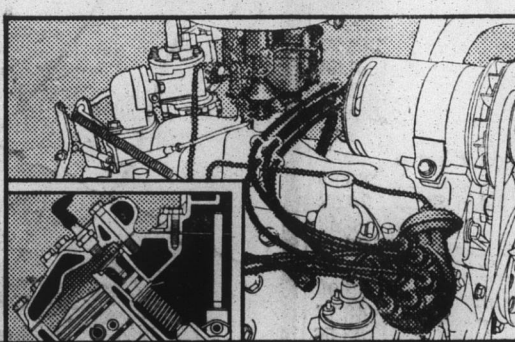
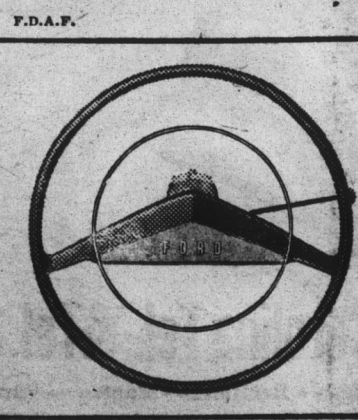
