

Aid Offered To File Income Tax Returns

Deputy Collector Robbins Announces His Schedule

Deputy Collector John N. Robbins, of the Windsor branch office of the Collector of internal revenue, will be in the Edenton post office building on February 4, 6, 11, 13, 14, 18, and 25th for the purpose of assisting taxpayers in the preparation and filing of their Federal income tax returns, instead of the regular Monday morning schedule that was observed during the month of January. During the last two weeks of the filing period from March 1st to March 15th, Deputy Collector Robbins will visit the Edenton post office only twice to assist taxpayers, as regulations require that he spend as nearly all of his time as possible in the Windsor office. The two dates for assisting Edenton taxpayers in March will be the 3rd and 10th.

A daily time-table of 9:30 A. M., to 12:45 P. M., and 1:30 P. M., to 4:30 P. M., will be adhered to as closely as possible for the convenience of Edenton taxpayers requiring assistance with their Federal income tax returns on the dates mentioned above, except that Deputy Collector Robbins will not be at the Edenton post office building after 12:45 P. M., on February 6th, having scheduled an appointment at the Blades Lumber Company offices here on that afternoon for the purpose of assisting employees of the company with their returns.

Also, the deputy collector will spend the day of February 7th at the M. G. Brown Company, Inc., assisting employees there.

Arrangements have been made with the Edenton post office to use the lobby of the building in case the number of people coming for income tax assistance should be too large for accommodation downstairs. Otherwise, the deputy collector will be working in the office of the county agriculture agent, C. W. Overman, on the basement floor of the post office building.

The Bureau of Internal Revenue is urging all taxpayers to file as early as possible and try to avoid the last-minute rush.

Every person with \$660 or more of income in 1951 before allowing for exemptions and deductions is required to file a Federal income tax return. In the case of income from the practice of a trade, business or profession, this means gross income.

Many people who had less than \$600 but more than \$400 income from self-employment should file an income tax return and pay the social security tax due on self-employment income.

This new social security tax on self-employment earnings is compulsory with self-employed people, with the exception of farmers, doctors, lawyers, accountants, architects, ministers, public officials, and others specifically exempt by law. The tax is based on the income tax return "Schedule C" at 2 1/2 per cent of the net profit and paid at the same time and in the same manner as income tax.

on amounts of self-employment net profits between \$400 and \$3600. Salaried people should attach original withholding statements (Form W-2) from all employers to their income tax returns.

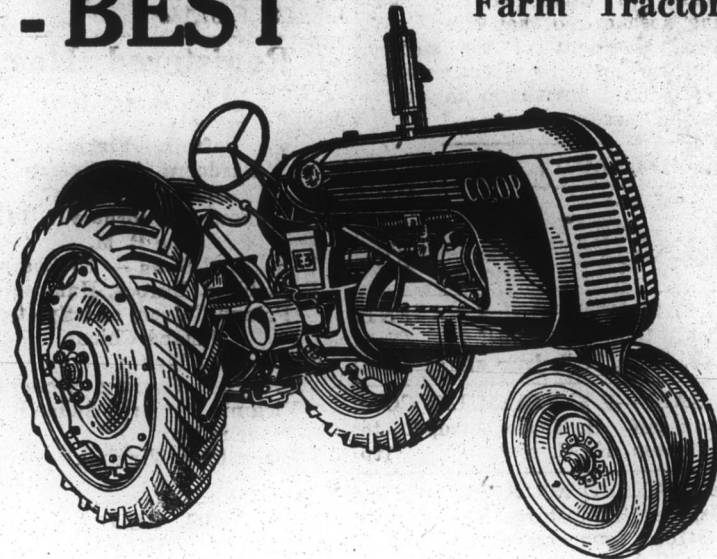

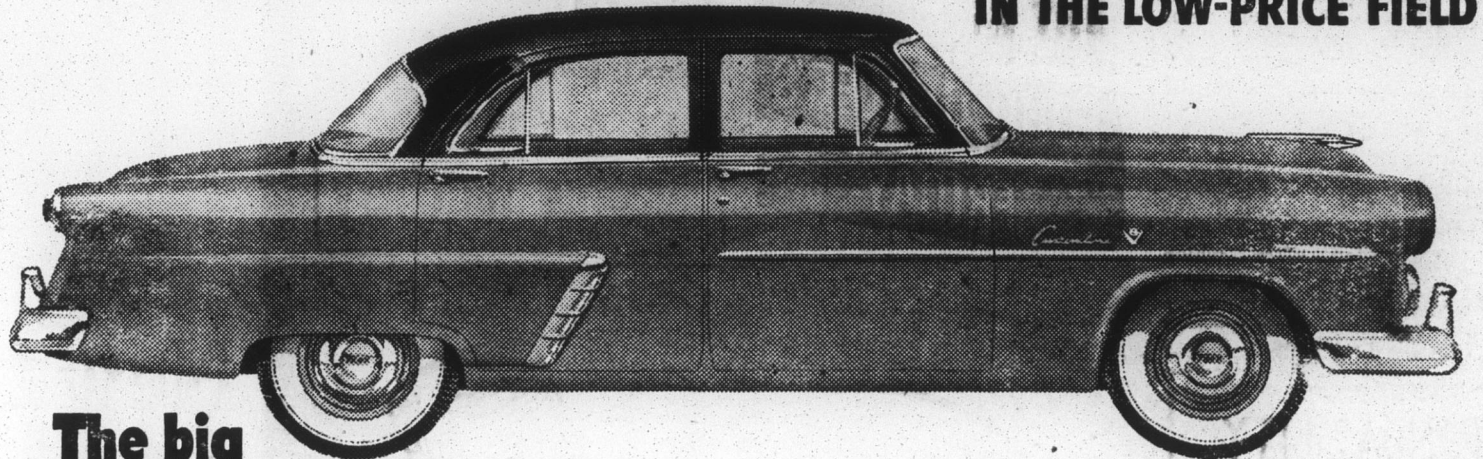

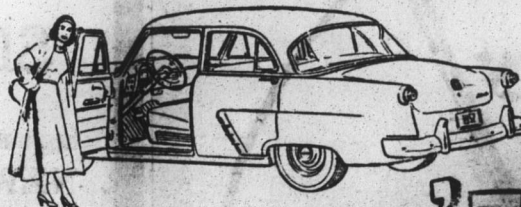
