Michigan Expert Helping To Increase Use Of Harbors

Plans for greater development and utilization of North Carolina's inland ports and waterways are being studied fully this week, George R. Ross, director of the State Department of Conservation and Development, has an-

Ross said that Michigan's Governor Mennen Williams has loaned Bert Robb, director of the Michigan State Waterways Commission, to the State for the purpose of making a study of North Carolina's inland ports and harbors with a view of making them of greater use to those who use them to gain their livelihoods.

Robb, a former Naval officer and ports authority, is accompanying members of the Board of Conservation and Development's Water Resources committee on a tour of several North Carolina inland ports. The tour is being made aboard the department's commercial fisheries boat, the Cape Lookout, and began Wednesday at Elizabeth City.

Among the State's inland ports to be visited are: Hatteras, Englehard, Manteo, Elizabeth City, Oriental, Van demere, and possibly some others Fishermen and others using the inland ports are invited to meet the committee and Robb and give their views with regard to development and great er use of the ports.

Water resources committee members making the trip are: Aubrey L. Cavenaugh of Warsaw, chairman Charles H. Jenkins of Ahoskie, vice chairman; Walter J. Damtoft of Canton, Ferd Davis of Zebulon, and Mrs. Roland McClamroch of Chapel Hill.
