February Defense Bond Sales Total \$23,878 In Chowan

Pender County Already Exceeded Its Quota For 1953

Sale of Series E, H, J, and K United States Defense Bonds in Chowan County for the month of February totaled \$23,878.75. Of this amount, \$20,378.75 was in Series E Bonds; \$1,500.00 in Series H Bonds; and \$2,000.00 in Series J & K Bonds (combined). This sales announcement is made by County Defense Bonds Chairman A. B. Harless, based on the

monthly sales report from Allison James, State Director of the U. S. Defense Bonds Division in Greensboro.

The total figures for North Carolina's 100 counties were as follows: Series E \$4,726,355.50; Series H \$161,000.00; Series J & K (combined) \$ 60,628.00; totaling \$5,547,983.50.

County Chairman Harless in announcing the above sales, explained that the foregoing state sales figures include \$574,000.00 of Series E Bonds purchased by North Carolinians in the Armed forces during January. These sales, which have not been previously reported, were distributed to North Carolina's 100 counties on a per capita basis in February sales.

Chairman Harless also stated that the people of Pender County have already, during the first two months of this year, exceeded their entire 1953 year's Defense Bonds sales quota. Pender is the only county in the state so far which has equalled or exceeded its 1953 quota.
