**Salted Peanut Cookies**  
(Wonderful for snacks and party fare)

1 cup lard or shortening	1 teaspoon salt
1 cup granulated sugar	1 1/2 cups sifted all purpose flour
1 cup dark brown sugar	1 cup rolled oats
1 teaspoon vanilla	1/2 pound salted Spanish peanuts
3 Tbsp. of hot water	

Cream lard; add sugars gradually and continue beating. Add vanilla and salt; beat thoroughly. Mix in rolled oats. Add peanuts; mix well. Form into small balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350° for 12-15 minutes or until light brown. Bake 12 cookies, 5 inches in diameter.
