Durward F. Bateman Is Awarded Honor Certificate

Durward Franklin Bateman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Benny Bateman of the Cross Roads community was honored last week at State College, where he is a member of the freshman class. Young Bateman was presented an honor certificate by Phi Kappa Phi in recognition for having earned freshman scholastic honors for the first two quarters of his freshman year at N. C. State College.

Bateman was also one of 10 top freshmen selected to compete for the Danforth scholarship. This scholarship is awarded annually to a freshman enrolled in agriculture education.

It is provided by the Danforth Foundation and pays for the entire cost of two weeks of intensive leadership training at Camp Miniwanca located on Lake Michigan from August 17 to August 30. Bateman has written a theme in the contest, but the winner has not yet been named. He was a member of the 1952 graduating class of Chowan High School.

Sunday afternoon, June 14, the Sluggers will meet the Wakefield, Va., Tigers on Hicks Field, the game starting at 2:45.

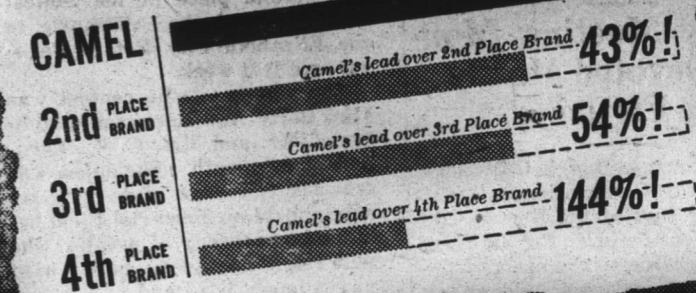
Saturday of this week the Sluggers are scheduled to meet the Greenville Giants, a member of the Virginia-Carolina League at 7:45.
