Native Of Edenton Dies In Berryville, Va.

Older residents of Edenton will regret to learn that funeral services were held last week in Berryville, Va., for Henderson Byron Harris, a native of Edenton. He was born in Edenton February 4, 1895, the son of the late George B. and Virginia Harris.

Deceased was postmaster in Berryville and died of a heart attack. He went to Berryville in 1920, where he was a partner in a drug store under the name of Moore and Harris, later becoming sole owner of the business. After selling his business he was appointed postmaster, which position he held at the time of his death.

He served as mayor of Berryville for several terms in the 1930's and it was under his administration that the

town constructed its present sewer system and disposal plant.

He was a member of the vestry of Grace Episcopal Church and served as treasurer of the church. He was active in civic affairs including the Chamber of Commerce, and was a charter member of the Lloyd Williams Post, American Legion and one-time commander.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Jane Allen Harris; two daughters by a former marriage to the late Fannie B. Davis of Richmond; Virginia L. Harris and Brooke G. Harris; three sisters, Mrs. A. L. Foster of Silver Springs, Md., Miss Ruth E. Harris of Norfolk, and Mrs. B. A. Chappell of Roanoke.

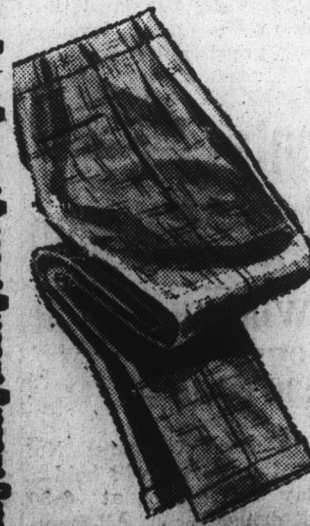
