### Dry Weather Reduces Yield But Prices Good

County County's watermelon crop has been very good considering the extremely dry season. While the melon yield is below normal, the price has been very good and most growers will do all right with their watermelons. Several growers have reported watermelon vines dying. The Congo variety was planted in most fields and this variety has very little resistance to wilt. Several fields have been visited by the County Agent, who took soil samples and plant specimens for analysis and diagnosis.

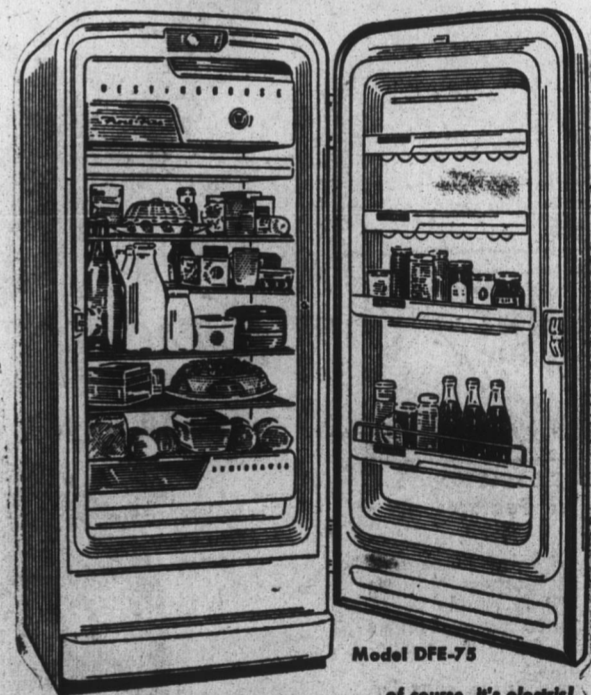
