Title To Hicks Field Will Be Aired

(Continued from Page One) las Crisp Hath Granted and Sold by these presents Doth Give, Grant, bargain, sell, aliene, Enfeoff—convey and confirm them the said Christopher Gale, John Lovick, Edward Mosely & Nicholas Crisp & their Successors as Fee Fees in Trust the one half of his said one hundred acres of Land Viz: that half thereto which Butts to the land of the said Town Land Divided by a line of marked trees the breadth of the Town land so far as to include the half of the said hundred acres together with all woods, waters, commodities & appurtenances therein to belonging and all other Estate, Right, Title, and Interest of the said Robert Hicks of and into the said Fifty Acres of Land with the appurtenances be the same more or less.

"To have and to hold the above granted Lands with all the Rights, Privileges, Conveniences & Appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Christopher Gale, John Lovick, Edward Mosely, & Nicholas Crisp, who are by Act of the Assembly appointed Commissioners for Laying out the said Town Land into half acre lots and dispose of the same to such as are minded to take them up and to their Successors for Ever as Fee Fees in Trust to and for the uses heretofore mentioned & no other (that is to say) to the only proper use benefit & behoof of the Freeholders & Inhabitants of the said Town that now are or hereafter shall be for Ever by whatever name or Limits that the said Town may ever be extended to or known to Lye Perpetually as a Common for the use of the said Town under such Regulations & Improvements

by the said Freeholders & Inhabitants as the Law, in such cases Directs and the Acts, Usages & Customs of North Carolina do or may Provide, and the said Robert Hicks himself, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators, doth hereby covenant to & with the said Christopher Gale, John Lovick, Edward Mosely & Nicholas Crisp & their Successors Fee Fees in Trust that the said Robert Hicks & his Heirs shall & will at any time hereafter make Execute & Acknowledge such further Act & Acts, things & things, Deeds, Devises, Conveyances & Assurances in the Law whatsoever for the further & more Legal & Perfect conveying, assigning & assuring the above Granted premises to the uses above mentioned according to the true Interest & Meaning Thereof as the said Fee Fees or the said Town of Freeholders & Inhabitants of the said Place or their Council only at their Cost & Charge at any time hereafter shall Reasonably Devise, Advise, Direct, or require according to the Laws of Great Britain & the Acts, Usages & Customs of the Province.

"In witness whereof the said Robert Hicks hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first before written.

"Robert Hicks."

Then in Deed Book M, page 249, the following was recorded in 1914:

"Whereas in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of North Carolina of the year 1913, Chapter 479 Public Laws, of the regular session, the Board of Councilmen of the Town of Edenton was authorized to lease, donate or sell to the Board of Trustees of the Chowan County Farm Life School, the lands hereinafter described and: Whereas the Board of Councilmen, at a regular meeting held on the 10th day of February 1914, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried unanimously, as will appear from the minutes of the said Board, directed a deed for the land herein described to be executed by its Mayor and attested by the Clerk to the Board in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Town of Edenton and in accordance with the act of the General Assembly of North Carolina, aforesaid. Now, therefore; this indenture made and entered into March 6, 1914, between the Board of Councilmen of the Town of Edenton of the first part and the Board of Trustees of Chowan County Farm Life School. A corporation created under special act of the General Assembly aforesaid, of the second part, witnesseth: That the party of the first part for and in consideration of the premises and of One Dollar to it in hand by the party of the second part paid, the receipt of which is acknowledged, has given, granted and conveyed to the party of the second

part and does hereby give, grant and convey to it the following real estate in the Town of Edenton, N. C., to wit: That part of the Town commons, except those parts thereof, heretofore sold off, bounded North by the Northern Boundary of the Town of Edenton, East by Oakum Street, South by Freemason and West by Main or Broad Street, to have and to hold to it the Board of Trustees of the Chowan County Farm Life School and to its successors and assigns forever. Provided, however, if said property shall cease to be used as a Farm Life School, then the same shall be and become the property of the Trustees of the Edenton Graded School but if the same shall cease to be used by it for public school purposes, then the said land shall revert to and become the property of the Town of Edenton. In witness of which the Board of Councilmen of the Town of Edenton has, in accordance with its Charter, caused this deed to be signed by its Mayor, attested by its Clerk and caused its Corporate seal to be hereto affixed, this 6th day of March 1914.

"R. F. Tuttle, Mayor."

The Farm Life School referred to never materialized, and when the present Junior-Senior High School was planned a committee from Town Council and the Edenton School Trustees decided where it should be located.

The purpose of next Tuesday night's meeting is, therefore, to try to find an approach to untangle the Hicks Field ownership problem.
