Jesse White, assistant chairman of the Chowan County Red Cross Disaster Committee, is high in praise of the efficient manner in which various people worked during Thursday night's severe storm. Mr. White served in the absence of the chairman, Mayor Leroy Haskett, who was out of town.

Mr. White called on the local National Guard unit, firemen and police, who remained on the alert during the night. John Ross, the police and the Edenton Marine Corps Auxiliary Landing Field's short wave radios were operating, so that contact of the storm's progress was checked every two minutes until it was only 15 miles from Edenton.

Due to this information preparations were rapidly made for any emergency and the armory, Court House and white and colored schools were open to house anyone who might have been injured or needed shelter due to the wind and rain. Many people spent the night in the armory and colored schools. Mr. White commented upon the efficiency of the organization, which was functioning 30 minutes after he called for action, and many cars were parked at the armory ready for any emergency.

Mr. White desires to thank every person who contributed in any way to the splendid success of the work done in connection with the storm and says he is proud of the willingness and cooperative spirit in which everyone responded when called upon.

Amendments Made To Septic Tank Ordinance

The District Board of Health at a meeting in Elizabeth City on August 11, amended the septic tank ordinance in the following manner.

Section 2 a a —No person shall start construction of a septic tank system until the Health Officer or his representative has first inspected the site and assisted in planning its location.

Section 4 is amended to read as follows:

Section 4 a—Every septic tank installation shall be in an unobstructed area, and the distances in the following table shall be the minimum dis-

tances which the septic tank system may be located from the objects listed:

Any private water supply, 50 feet horizontal.

Any property line, 10 feet.

When existing wells are involved, or where exceptionally coarse soil formations are encountered, the 50 foot horizontal distance from any water supply shall be deemed necessary by the Health Officer.

CUBED STEAK, COUNTRY STYLE

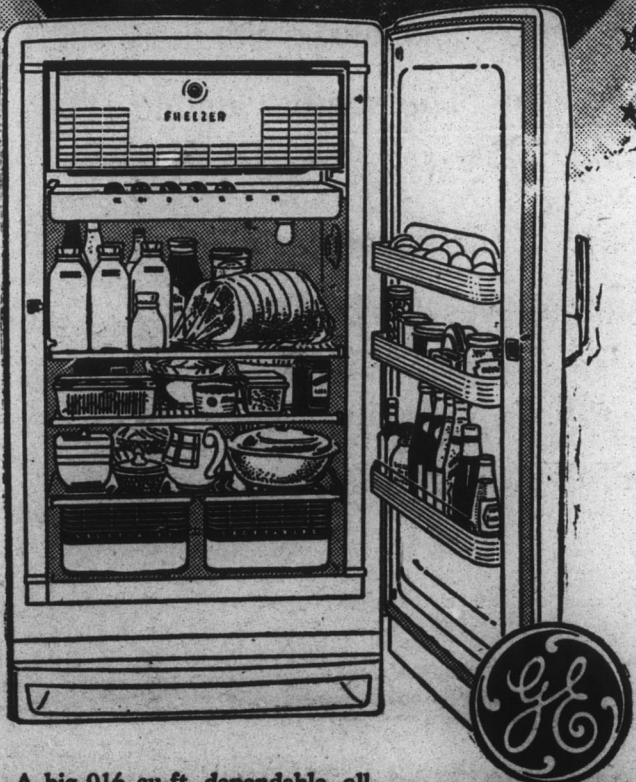
- 4 cubed steaks (about 1/4 lb. each) 1 tablespoon brown sugar
3/4 cup EB catsup 2 cup Worcestershire Sauce
3 tablespoons fat 1/4 cup water
Flour, salt and pepper
1 onion, chopped
2 tablespoons vinegar

Melt fat in heavy skillet. Dip steaks in flour mixed with seasonings. Brown meat with onions in hot fat. Add remaining ingredients. Cover and cook slowly until meat is fork-tender, about 30 minutes. Makes 4 servings.
