

Helen Lackey Weds R. Hector Lupton, Jr. Wedding Solemnized In Asheville Sunday, September 6

The wedding of Miss Helen Augusta Lackey to Rufus Hector Lupton, Jr., was solemnized on Sunday, September 6th, in an afternoon ceremony in the chapel of Central Methodist Church, Asheville, N. C. The double ring ceremony was performed by the pastor, Dr. E. H. Blackard.

Charles Joliff, organist, presented a program of wedding music.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dixon Alexander Lackey of Asheville and the bridegroom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Hector Lupton of Edenton.

The bride, given in marriage by her father, wore a ballerina-length gown of nylon tulle and chantilly lace over satin.
