### Hathaway Body Moved From Old Cemetery

Street, now owned and occupied by Mrs. B. F. Francis. He was a member of the Methodist Church, having joined in 1849.

The casket in which the deceased was buried was molded to conform to the body, which gave it a mummy-like appearance compared with the modern caskets of today. It was of cast iron, 6 feet 9 inches long, 24 inches across the shoulders, 10 inches across the head, 17 inches high at the head, 15 inches at the middle and 13 inches at the feet.

Over the head was an oval disc of cast iron, which swung around on a pivot revealing a thick plate of glass over the face. The glass measured 10 inches in length and 6 inches wide. It was remarkable how freely the disc swung away from the head of the casket after being in the ground for 96 years. There was no corrosion or sticky substance along the edge of the plate, but dirt and corrosion was prominent underneath the glass, making it impossible to see into the casket.

The bottom and top of the casket appeared to have been cast in a mold and were bolted together at intervals of about 7 inches all the way around. There were six cast iron handles, three on each side, and the top of the casket was cast to resemble folds like a drapery. It was very heavy. Tradition says it was borne to Mr. Hathaway's first resting place by his slaves, it being too heavy to be carried by the pallbearers.

Mrs. Hathaway had evidently been buried in a wood coffin when she died five years later. This had disintegrated and the remains were placed in a smaller box and buried in the grave with her husband. PARTY PEACH VELVET

1 tall can CB evaporated milk 1/4 cup sugar  
1 No. 2 1/2 can CB cling peach 1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup syrup from peaches 1/2 cup lemon juice  
1 envelope unflavored gelatin 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind  
1 envelope unflavored gelatin Chocolate wafers

Chill evaporated milk in refrigerator tray to ice-cream stage. Drain peach halves; dice, reserving one peach half for garnish. Soften gelatin in 1/2 cup syrup; place over low heat and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Remove from heat; add sugar and salt and stir until dissolved. Mix in lemon juice and rind; chill until mixture is the consistency of soft-set egg whites. Crumble wafers very fine. While chilled evaporated milk will set, beat in gelatin mixture, fold in diced peaches, turn velvet mixture into a lightly oiled 2-quart mold alternating with two layers of wafers. Chill until firm. To serve, unmold and garnish with peach half. Makes 10 servings.
